This Week Pastor Aaron asks: "What might we learn about caring for others through the various ways that Jesus responds to those who learn about the death of Lazarus?"

Greetings, Friends!

On this final Sunday before we enter into Holy Week, we will be devoting all of our attention to reading a lengthy passage from the Gospel of John. In this account, Jesus offers his seventh and

greatest sign before his crucifixion, raising Lazarus of Bethany from the dead. Throughout the narrative, Jesus confidently speaks of Lazarus' death as necessary, so that in his resurrection, God might reveal the glory of the "Son of God" who is sent to "awaken him." But despite his own trust in the plan for salvation, Jesus is still filled with compassion, when he sees Mary weeping over the loss of her brother Lazarus.

Like Jesus, we too might place our full trust in God's work of salvation, including Christ's assurance that all who believe in him shall not perish, but shall be raised from death to eternal life. And yet, as our Lord shows us, our confidence in God does not mean that we will not still suffer from the pain of loss, nor does it mean that we should be dismissive of the pain of others.

Throughout our lifetime, we will encounter a world filled with hurting people. And while we are called to point God's children toward the signs of the resurrection, we will often need to first weep with them as we all suffer together in our moments of great loss.


Prior to sharing in worship this week, you may benefit from spending time reading and reflecting upon this passage. We will be reading from the Gospel According to John, chapter eleven, verses one through fifty-three. Given the length of this reading, you may find it helpful to divide it into sections and to pause between each portion before continuing to the next. After reading these texts, please consider your responses to these questions:

- What might we learn about caring for others through the various ways that Jesus responds to those who learn about the death of Lazarus?
- How might Jesus also be offering us a lesson in self-care, even as we are seeking to minister to others in the midst of their own grieving?

As we draw ever closer to the cross, let us also draw close to one another in worship. I hope that you'll be able to join us on Sunday morning. We gather in-person at 10:30 a.m. here in the sanctuary at 718 Court Street in Fulton. You're welcome to join us here, or to share in worship "virtually" by viewing the simultaneous livestream of our worship gathering, which is available on the congregation's YouTube channel. Should you need to experience worship at another time of your choosing, please look for the videos of our gatherings, which are archived on the church's YouTube channel, once worship has concluded.

Friends, let us go with Jesus and his disciples, so that we might be made witnesses to the miraculous signs that he offers to the world. And as we see his works and believe in his word, let us share what has been made known to us, so that others might feel welcome to come and join with us in our worship and our ministry!

May grace and peace be yours in abundance!



The Compassion to Cry

While the focus of this week's Gospel Lesson tends to be upon the

glorious sign of Lazarus' resurrection from the dead, the writer devotes much of this story to exploring the ways in which Jesus responds to those who learn of the death of their friend and brother. When his sisters send a message to Jesus, alerting him to the illness of their brother, Jesus assures the disciples that this sickness will be the means for God to reveal Jesus' glory to the world. And when Martha comes to meet Jesus on his way to Bethany, he assures her that, "those who believe in me, even though they die, will live." (John 11:25).

But when Jesus meets Mary, she kneels at his feet and weeps for the loss of her brother. Despite knowing that Lazarus would soon be raised and returned to his sisters, Jesus still has compassion for her in her grief. And he weeps with her. Our Lord's own expression of emotion, is a reminder for each person of faith that even while we maintain our hope for the fulfillment of God's glory through the resurrection, in this moment, God's people are hurting in the world. And as the body of Christ, we should grieve with all of who suffer from loss.




We're "Growing in God's Love" This Sunday!


