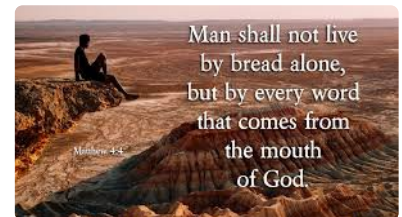

### Children's Sunday School: Foundations in Practice!

The Children and Youth Sunday School meets on a hybrid schedule. On the **First and Fifth Sundays of the month**, the children will stay in the larger worship service with the congregation. In this way, the children will become familiar with the prayers, songs, and sacraments we practice each week. The first Sunday being our Communion Sunday is especially good for this exposure. On the fifth Sunday, Pastor Carol intends to construct a special student-friendly service that will allow them to be more actively involved.

On the **Second, Third, and Fourth Sundays of the month**, the children will go out to Sunday School immediately after the Children's Moment as before. During Sunday School, they will learn and practice weekly the special prayers, songs, and Passing of the Peace we use in the larger worship service. In addition, we will be using the Growing in God's Love Story Bible for core lessons.

Westminster College students be serving as our Children's Sunday School Teaching Team during the pull-out sessions again semester. We are so grateful to have the God-given talents of these young adults at work in our congregation!

### The Rock - A Christian Education Experience for Middle & High School Students!

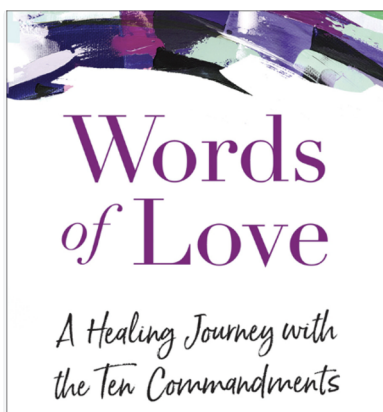

Participants will meet each Wednesday evening for this 6-week examination of Donald L. Griggs book *The Bible from Scratch: The New Testament for Beginners*.

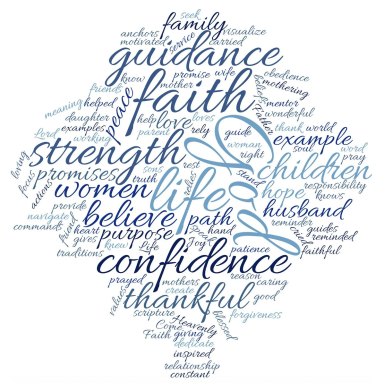
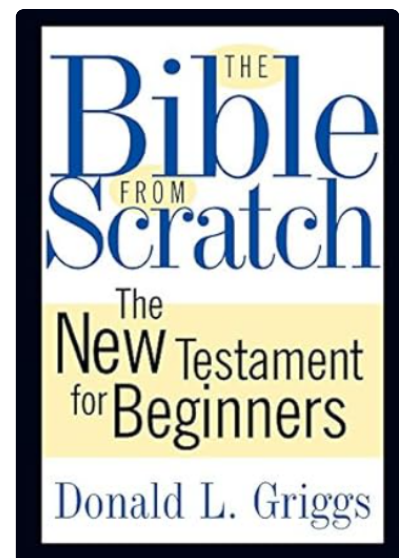
We'll take turns providing a crockpot of soup or other hot dish for a light meal as Pastor Carol leads us through an examination of the books of the New Testament.

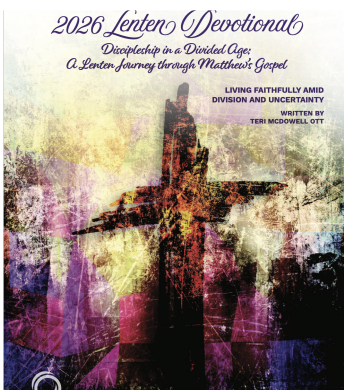
## Women of Faith Group Meets Every 2nd Saturday!

## Lenten Reflections & Service Information



### Lenten Devotional Booklet Ready for Download or Pick-Up

An Introduction to Presbyterian Outlook's 2026 *Lenten Devotional Discipleship in a Divided Age, A Journey through Matthew's Gospel*. In this thought provoking work, Rev. Terri McDowell Ott explores living faithfully amid division and uncertainty.

The Gospel of Matthew feels strikingly contemporary. Matthew's first audience was seeking

a faithful path in a turbulent, confusing time. Scholars believe this early church was young and fragile, formed of Jewish followers of Jesus who had recently left—or been pushed out of—their synagogues. Tensions were high, beliefs deeply rooted, divisions painful. Matthew's Gospel includes harsh rhetoric about Jews that should never be removed from context or applied to all Jews; it reflects the heartbreak of a community in conflict and the sharp feelings that arise when good people disagree on matters of deep conviction. This church also lived in a diverse urban setting, sharing space with Gentiles — people they had long been taught to avoid. Into this setting

Matthew proclaims a kingdom breaking in – a way of life grounded in humility, compassion, and courage.

As we walk through Matthew during Lent, we too are invited to follow Jesus on the narrow path, confront our own divisions, and seek God's kingdom amid today's fractures.

Week 4: Jesus Calls Us to the Margins

Day 19:

Matthew 8:2-4

Focus Verse: Matthew 8:2-3 - *And there was a man with a skin disease who came to him and knelt before him, saying, "Lord, if you are willing, you can make me clean." He stretched out his hand and touched him, saying, "I am willing. Be made clean!" Immediately his skin disease was cleansed.*



This passage offers the first of three healing stories in Matthew, chapter 8. Each features someone who lives on the edge of society: a leper, a Gentile slave and a woman. Each story shows Jesus reaching across boundaries – religious, cultural and gendered – to restore life where others have drawn lines.

Leprosy in Jesus' day meant more than a skin disease. It carried the weight of moral suspicion. People believed leprosy was a punishment for sin. People with leprosy were cast out, were made to live apart and were required to shout "Unclean!" if anyone came near. To touch one was to risk both infection and ritual defilement. The law of Moses warned that anyone who touched an unclean person became unclean themselves (Leviticus 5:1-3). But Jesus touches him anyway. In that single gesture, Jesus not only heals a disease but also shatters stigma. He fulfills, not abolishes, the intent of the law. As Jesus says in Matthew 5:17, the heart of God's law is restoration: to bring people back into right relationship with one another and with God. The miracle here is physical, yes, but it's also social and spiritual. The leper is made whole, both in body and in belonging.

People all around us live on society's edges: the unhoused on our streets, the Dalits of India, the millions incarcerated in America. Jesus' ministry doesn't keep these people at the margins; he moves straight toward them. And his work isn't a side project or a short-term mission trip. It's the ongoing priority of God's kingdom. If we are to follow Jesus, then we must center these people on our path of discipleship.

Reflection: Who today lives on the margins of your community? How might you, in word or action, reach across boundaries to restore relationship and dignity in Christ's name?

Prayer: *Healing God, you reach across every line we draw and touch what we fear to touch. Cleanse our hearts of prejudice and indifference. Lead us to the margins where you already dwell, and make us instruments of your restoring love. Amen.*

A wide variety of native wildflowers, grasses, shrubs, trees, vines, and sedges from Grow Native! professional members will be available for purchase at this sale. Some vendors accept cash, check, or credit cards; some only cash or checks.

Vendors: Gaylena’s Garden, Grindstone Wildflowers, Missouri Wildflowers Nursery, Ozark Soul, and Prairie Hill Farm.

Shoppers can stroll through the sale and purchase plants from each vendor; each vendor must be paid separately. “Early birds” who arrive prior to 10 a.m. will be asked to wait until the advertised start time to begin browsing product selections and making purchases.
